We understand your frustration with the return of the aphids to our boulevard trees after they were treated this spring. The Board voted to do a second injection in late August or early September. Also, the Board voted earlier this year to plant 3 new trees this summer, in one of the HOA owned parks.

PETS, BIRDS and Wildlife

Our Covenants indicate that we may only have two dogs or two cats. They cannot be a nuisance to the neighborhood. No excessive barking! Also note that pigeons can carry diseases. Please refrain from feeding them! Currently our neighborhood has a fox, squirrels, bunnies and raccoons. Please do not feed these animals. Keep your pet food inside.

RECREATIONAL VEHICLES, RV'S, BOATS, UTILITY TRAILERS, CAMPERS AND RAFTS

These types of vehicles are not permitted to be on the street or in your driveway for not more than 48 hours according to our Restrictive Covenants. However, the City has indicated that you have 5 days. These vehicles are not permitted to block sidewalks or alley ways. NEVER place an extension cord across the sidewalk. This is a safety violation. REMINDERS

We live in the City limits and there is a Leash Law while you are out with your dog. Each household may only have 2 dogs. Please clean up after your dog when walking. We have several dog stations throughout the neighborhood. And remember, not everyone is a Cat lover. They should not be allowed to become a nuisance to neighbors. Also, only 2 cats are allowed per household.

LIGHTS

The HOA Board is working on the issues with our streetlights that are not working. We currently have 3 lights that are out. LANDSCAPING AND LAWN CARE

Lawns and landscaping that is not being taken care of will receive a door hanger or a letter asking that it be taken care of. According to our Covenants, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to take care of this and/or advise your renter.
